If you have a child or grandchild in the Toddler and Pre-School and would like to be more involved at the setting, then please speak to the office. We could accommodate one parent/grandparent per morning and would organise it on a rota basis. You would be supported by the Toddler and Pre-School staff and would have the opportunity to help with cooking activities, read a story to the children or join in with our favourite nursery rhymes.

Parents Policy Board

This month the staff have reviewed the Fire Policy, Sleep and Rest Policy, Illness Policy and Equal Opportunities Policy. These are displayed on the Parent's Policy Board in the reception area. If you have any comments or feedback about the policies please speak to a member of staff.

Opportunities that your child will experience on a daily basis

Planned activities, such as key person circle time, physical focus, story time and personalised planning, provide babies and children with opportunities to develop a range of secure and positive relationships.

- Talk Time Daily at 9.30am: All key persons plan daily talk time activities to support the development of their key children with a focus on communication and language development. These small circle times provide opportunities for your child to actively communicate, listen to others, respond to each other's thoughts and ideas and work in small groups. This enables your child to grow in confidence, develop their self-esteem and become more independent in a range of situations.
- Physical Focus: Babies and children learn by being active and physical development takes place across all areas of learning and development. Physical activities enable your child to feel the positive benefits of being healthy and active and help them to develop a positive sense of well-being. We plan a daily physical focus and encourage physical play in all aspects of learning.
- Personalised Planning: Your child's key person
 plans daily next steps for your child, tailored to
 meet his/her individual needs, cultural
 background and interests. Key persons make
 observations of these activities which then help
 them to plan future next steps for your child's
 learning, development and interests.

- Café Snack/Lunch: Café snack encourages
 your child to make their own healthy choices
 about what they would like to eat and drink.
 Café snack and lunch times encourage children
 and adults to actively communicate, listen and
 respond to each other's ideas.
- Free-Play: Your child has access to all the resources in their room so if there is something specific they would like they are free to make their own choices.
- Free-Flow: The inside and outside environments are separated into the 7 areas of learning. This helps your child's key person to plan a wide range of activities to help your child progress towards the early learning goals. There is a balance of communication friendly spaces both inside and outside which provide many learning opportunities for the children. We are not only taking the 'learning environment' outdoors, but bringing the outdoors in to the 'learning environment' using natural objects.

Designated Safeguarding Team

As part of our safeguarding procedures we have a Designated Safeguarding Lead who is **Lorna Trudgeon**, a Deputy Designated Safeguarding Lead who is **Juliette George** and an Assistant Designated Safeguarding Lead who is **Briony Sedgeman**.

Mark Fletcher is currently the Designated Safeguarding Lead on the Management Committee. More information is available in our policies and procedures, which are displayed in the reception area. We also have spare copies for parents to borrow and read at their convenience.

We have compiled a Safeguarding Guidance, entitled 'Keeping Your Child Safe', to help staff and parents learn about simple conversations to keep children safe from abuse. The guidance is available from the office and can be taken home to read at your leisure.
