Welcome Back!

We would like to say a huge thank you to you all for your support in ensuring all your children returned so positively to nursery. It has been really lovely welcoming the children back after such a long time and we are looking forward to the new academic year ahead.

Opportunities that your child will experience on a daily basis

Planned activities, such as key person circle time, physical focus, story time and personalised planning, provide babies and children with opportunities to develop a range of secure and positive relationships.

- Palk Time Daily at 9.30am: All key persons plan daily talk time activities to support the development of their key children with a focus on communication and language development. These small circle times provide opportunities for your child to actively communicate, listen to others, respond to each other's thoughts and ideas and work in small groups. This enables your child to grow in confidence, develop their self-esteem and become more independent in a range of situations.
- Physical Focus: Babies and children learn by being active and physical development takes place across all areas of learning and development. Physical activities enable your child to feel the positive benefits of being healthy and active and help them to develop a positive sense of well-being. We plan a daily physical focus and encourage physical play in all aspects of learning.
- Personalised Planning: Your child's key person
 plans daily next steps for your child, tailored to
 meet his/her individual needs, cultural
 background and interests. Key persons make
 observations of these activities which then help
 them to plan future next steps for your child's
 learning, development and interests.
- Café Snack/Lunch: Café snack encourages your child to make their own healthy choices about what they would like to eat and drink. Café snack and lunch times encourage children and adults to actively communicate, listen and respond to each other's ideas.

- Free-Flow: The inside and outside environments are separated into the 7 areas of learning. This helps your child's key person to plan a wide range of activities to help your child progress towards the early learning goals. There is a balance of communication friendly spaces both inside and outside which provide many learning opportunities for the children. We are not only taking the 'learning environment' outdoors but bringing the outdoors in to the 'learning environment' using natural objects.
- Free-Play: Your child has access to all the resources in their room so if there is something specific, they would like they are free to make their own choices.

Role Play Areas

Every term each room creates a new and exciting role-play area based on our termly themes and the interests expressed by the children. This term the baby room has created a fruit and vegetable shop, the toddlers have designed a jungle area and the pre-school have created a construction site.

Oasis/British Values

We are working with the staff and children to promote positive Oasis/British Values. Each day at circle time the staff and children will reflect together about wanted and unwanted behaviour and how that makes the children and staff feel. Each week a child will be presented with an award for demonstrating positive behaviour and promoting the Oasis/British Values. This award will be promoted throughout the week and will be shared with parents on collection.

Onsite Forest School sessions

Working in partnership with Ludgvan School we are developing an onsite forest school area. This will enable us to continue to provide forest school opportunities inline with COVID-19 safety measures. The Pre-school and Toddler room children will all be given the opportunity to attend forest school sessions onsite in their class groups. These sessions will be led by Jo Cooper from Heart of the Woods based in Cubit Woods in Carbis Bay and assisted by our Oasis Forest School leader Hollie Empson. All activities will link to the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) Framework, with a focus on naturebased learning, developing life skills, making choices and child-led play and exploration. Children will be given endless opportunities to participate in real-life experiences and enjoy the benefits of outdoor learning, which will provide inspirational learning opportunities and memories. These learning experiences will also be linked to the Oasis onsite growing project and our environmentally friendly approach.

Designated Safeguarding Team

As part of our safeguarding procedures we have a Designated Safeguarding Lead who is **Lorna Trudgeon**, a Deputy Designated Safeguarding Lead who is **Juliette George** and an Assistant Designated Safeguarding Lead who is **Briony Sedgeman**.
