<u>Keeping Your Children Safe</u> Driving onto School Premises

For those of you who may not be aware, for health and safety reasons, you are not permitted to drive onto school premises between 8.30am and 9.00am and 3.00pm and 3.30pm when the school children are being dropped off and collected. The path from Ludgvan Community Centre provides a safe route for young children and parents/carers to access the Oasis and Ludgvan School.



Also, could we please remind parents/carers to only park in the yellow accessible parking space if you have either a blue badge parking permit or a Ludgvan School Parking Permit.

<u>Opportunities that your child will experience on a</u> <u>daily basis during their time at Oasis</u>

Planned activities, such as key person circle time, physical focus, story time and personalised planning, provide babies and children with opportunities to develop a range of secure and positive relationships.

• Talk Time: All key persons plan daily talk time activities to support the development of their key children with a focus on communication and language development. These small circle times provide opportunities for your child to actively communicate, listen to others, respond to each other's thoughts and ideas and work in small groups. This enables your child to grow in confidence, develop their self-esteem and become more independent in a range of situations.

- **Phonics Time:** Pre-School staff follow the Read Write Inc phonics programme to support the children with their developing their early reading and writing skills.
- **Physical Focus:** Babies and children learn by being active and physical development takes place across all areas of learning and development. Physical activities enable your child to feel the positive benefits of being healthy and active and help them to develop a positive sense of wellbeing. We plan a daily physical focus and encourage physical play in all aspects of learning.
- **Personalised Planning:** Your child's key person plans daily next steps for your child, tailored to meet his/her individual needs, cultural background and interests. Key persons make observations of these activities which then help them to plan future next steps for your child's learning, development and interests.
- Café Snack/Lunch: Café snack encourages your child to make their own healthy choices about what they would like to eat and drink. Café snack and lunch times encourage children and adults to actively communicate, listen and respond to each other's ideas.
- Free-Flow: The inside and outside environments are separated into the 7 areas of learning. This helps your child's key person to plan a wide range of activities to help your child progress towards the early learning goals. There is a balance of communication friendly spaces both inside and outside which provide many learning opportunities for the children. We are not only taking the 'learning environment' outdoors but bringing the outdoors in to the 'learning environment' using natural objects.
- Free-Play: Your child has access to all the resources in their room so if there is something specific, they would like they are free to make their own choices.

Role Play Areas

Every term each room creates a new and exciting role-play area based on our termly themes and the interests expressed by the children. This term the baby room has created a **Construction Site** to support the babies with exploring a wide range of textures and construction materials to develop hand eye co-ordination.

The toddlers have designed a **Jungle Area** to develop understanding of a wide range of animals and their habitats.

The pre-school have created a **Space Area** to support their understanding of our solar system, to encourage them to plan, design and create their own space rockets and to involve the children in their topic by providing a wide range of reading material.

We will be celebrating International Talk Like a Pirate Day on Monday 20.09.21. Your child can dress up as a pirate if they wish and there will be lots of fun pirate related activities planned throughout the day.
