Dear families,

Staffing

We are pleased to welcome Paula Manning, our new Administrator, to the Oasis team. She will be joining us at the end of March and will be working closely with Lorna over the Easter Holidays.

Role Play Areas

Every term each room creates a new and exciting display/role-play area based on our termly themes and the interests expressed by the children.

This term the baby room has created Superworm which is supporting the babies with learning animal names, animal sounds, new animal songs and rhymes and demonstrating emotional empathy through acting out roles and behaviours which develop self-esteem and self-confidence.



The toddlers and Pre-School are exploring The Very Hungry Caterpillar and learning about the life cycle of a butterfly and other animals. They will be exploring healthy eating, learning about different fruits and vegetables and counting items from the story. The children will have opportunities to consolidate their learning through meaningful experiences and test out their own ideas by creating their own insect gardens. We are also eagerly awaiting the arrival of our very own caterpillar eggs to hatch in our butterfly garden!

The toddlers and pre-school have also created a Farm Shop which provides opportunities for the children to explore money, numbers and counting, promoting children's understanding of exchanging money and teaching mathematical concepts though play. They will also be learning about where their food comes from, healthy and unhealthy food choices, oral hygiene, exercise and how we look after our bodies, and working towards exploring healthy food options that we can plant in our Oasis garden. The Farm Shop role-play also provides opportunities for the children to extend upon their learning and begin to explore different occupations and roles within our community, such as shop keepers, delivery drivers, emergency services, farmers, etc.

If your child has any related items, such as story books, props or pictures, then please feel free to bring them in. Your child can share these with their friends during circle times.

Minack Theatre - Pre-School trip

Before half-term the Pre-School children had the opportunity to visit the Minack Theatre. During their visit the children learnt about the history of the Minack, explored the venue including the stage area and behind the scenes, and created their own performance on the stage supported by the staff and music and dance professionals from MADE.

World Book Day is on Thursday 2^{nd} March 2023. To celebrate we will be looking at a variety of different books and stories from around the world. We will also be dressing in fancy dress and your child can come to nursery dressed as their favourite story character if they wish.
